DISABILITY DISCRIMINATION LAW COMES INTO EFFECT

The final stage of the island's anti-discrimination law came into effect on 1st September. Jersey companies could now face a fine if they cannot prove that reasonable improvements for people with disabilities have been made.

Our President, Will Ross was interviewed live on BBC Radio Jersey about the legislation and said, "people shouldn't be intimidated by the changes. We don't want people to feel "chastised" for admitting their workplaces are not accessible." He added, "We have members who have a range of disabilities and any of us would be happy to come try out, give feedback, assist and do whatever we can to help."
